² 'Wo Es war, soll Ich werden' (Freud GW XV, 1940 [1933]: 86). In Strachey's translation (1964) of *Neue Folge*, which has predominated in the Anglo-American tradition, he interpolates an uncanny 'there' — rendering it as 'Where Id was, *there* Ego shall be' (SE XXII, Lecture 31, emphasis added). This 'there' functions as a phantasm: a false double of 'where' that over fixes It to a determinate location and theoretics of presence, rendering it epistemically graspable, i.e. too canny.
